### **Dear Parishioners**

On Thursday I attended the solemn celebration of the Eucharist in Worcester Cathedral, with which I have connections, to mark the 800<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the dedication of the cathedral. On 7 June 1218 a service of dedication took place in the presence of King Henry III, whose father, King John, is buried in the cathedral. Building had begun under St Wulstan in 1084 but collapses and fires delayed the completion.

Like the other great cathedrals Worcester Cathedral bears witness to the living faith of our forefathers and today, like all churches, the cathedral stands as a sacramental symbol that our belief in God is rooted in our humanity. God is not an intellectual concept. Through Jesus we know that God lives with us, albeit in a way different from members of our families or our next door neighbours. Though church buildings are simply to gather people to worship God and enable the community to grow in furthering the faith and commitment of believers, the stones and bricks and slates do make a point – that we are 'in the world' the world which God has created and found 'to be very good'.

Footnote: only a few years after the consecration of Worcester Cathedral the then bishop decided to knock down the east end of the cathedral to make a much more grand edifice. Somehow, that in itself speaks to us about our faith – building, dismantling, rebuilding, going forward. Our Christian faith is not a fossil, but something alive and active, a power maintaining the truths of God's love for us all, but open to change in the ways we express our faith in the midst of our present day culture. We too are people on the march, a pilgrim people on our way to the heavenly Jerusalem.

Let us pray this weekend for Bishop John Inge, Bishop of Worcester, the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral and all those who worship at the cathedral.
