## ***Dear Parishioners and Friends***

We are now in the month of the Rosary and on Wednesday we celebrated the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius V after a naval battle gave victory over the Turks at the battle of Lepanto in 1571! It is a good thing to have these months / days / feasts, to remind us of important aspects of our Christian faith and it may be worth reflecting on the significance of the rosary.

It took me a long time to engage with the rosary as a daily prayer but my parent had a great devotion to this prayer and I could hear them saying the rosary in their bedroom every night of their lives. Back in 1980 my younger brother developed cancer. I felt lost and dazed, and turned to the rosary as a means of praying when other words failed me. What a discovery! The prayer carries us along: Our Father, ten Hail Marys, Glory be to the Father. Reciting the Hail Marys acts as the background to our reflection on the particular 'mystery', the event in the life of Jesus and Mary, on which we reflect. It is traditional that we say the Joyful mysteries on Mondays and Saturdays, the Sorrowful mysteries on Tuesdays and Fridays, the Mysteries of Light on Thursdays, and the Glorious mysteries on Sundays and Wednesdays. As we pray through the week we are journeying with Jesus and Mary. Starting with the Annunciation, when the angel visited Mary, we continue through the birth and the ministry of Jesus. We are with Him in his times of suffering, and celebrate the glorious events of Jesus' resurrection and Mary's coronation as queen of heaven.

Appropriately, the first of the Joyful mysteries is The Annunciation which marks the entry of Jesus into human history. Mary said, 'Yes' to God. From the beginning of her existence that was her attitude. She listened to God and pondered in her heart all that was taking place around her. The Sorrowful mysteries begin with the Agony in the Garden, reminding us of how Jesus left the company of his apostles at the Last Supper to prepare himself for what lay ahead. Pope St John Paul introduced the Mysteries of life, those events in the life of Jesus which still bring light and life into our lives, such as The Baptism of Jesus, the Marriage at Cana, Jesus preaching about the Kingdom of God, the Transfiguration and the Last Supper. The Resurrection of Jesus, the Descent of the Holy Spirit and the Coronation of Mary are among the mysteries included in the Glorious mysteries.

I do commend the rosary to you all. It is an adaptable way of praying. We can set aside a time of prayer during the day; recite the rosary as we walk along the road to our workplaces; or just pray a decade as time allows. Our Lady of the rosary, pray for us.

### **The Importance of Track & Trace: details needed for each Mass.**

With the present uneasy situation it is even more important than ever for everyone who attends Mass, however many times in a week, to register. Filling out a slip of paper when you reach church is causing delays, requires sanitising of pens and increases the number of pieces of paper handled by stewards. So please, as well as remembering your face covering when you set out for Mass, can you also remember to bring with you your slip of paper showing name and contact number.

**An even better way to register attendance is by going to [covid19.nhs.uk](https://www.covid19.nhs.uk) and seeing if you can download on to your phone the NHS Track & Trace app then scan the QR code displayed on posters at the back of church. It's quick, easy, hygienic and safe. Thank you for your help in making this happen.**



## **Domestic Abuse Concerns**

One of the effects of lockdown in March was an increase in reported cases of **domestic violence** and the National Domestic Violence Helpline (**Refuge**) have recently announced a further rise in such reports as restrictions continue or as in this area, even tighten.

**Boots** chemist in Ormskirk have confirmed that their “**Safe Space**” project established in April with Refuge, is to continue indefinitely.

Under this scheme, anyone suffering from, or in fear of domestic abuse can go into **any** Boots Pharmacy and be offered the safety and privacy of the pharmacist’s Consulting Room.

There they will be able to call the **Domestic Violence Helpline 0808 2000 247** for help and support.

If you are a victim of domestic violence (or worried about someone else), the helpline is there for you.
